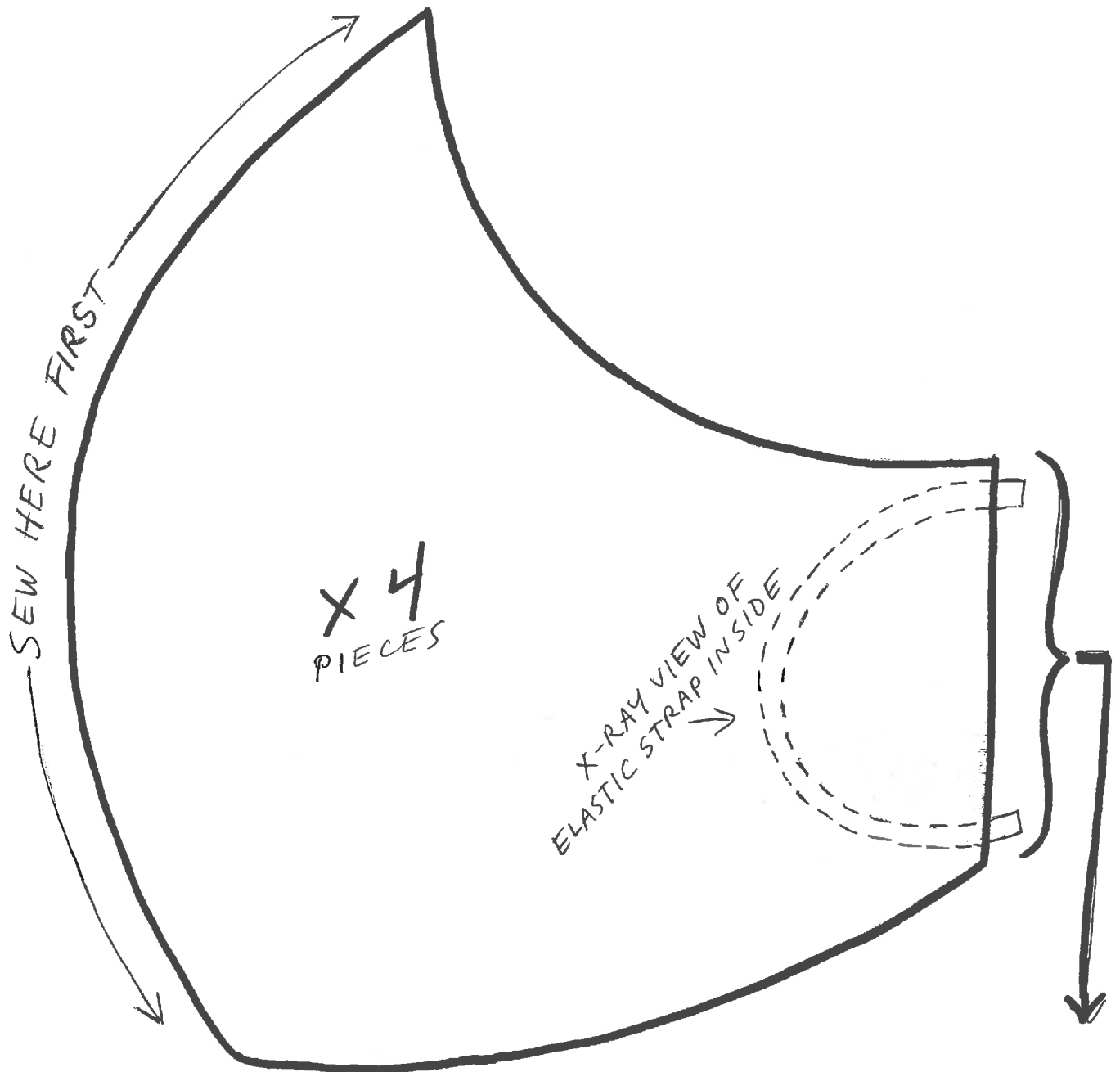


# LESLIE'S MASK PATTERN



LEAVE THIS EDGE  
OPEN AT FIRST AND  
PUSH ELASTIC STRAPS  
INTO THE HOLE WITH  
THE TIPS AT THE EDGE

## Leslie's Mask Pattern

1. Cut out two pieces of fabric with wrong sides together. Then two more of another fabric.
2. Pin together first set of pieces and sew along curved edge. Repeat with second pieces of fabric (look at diagram first before sewing).
3. Turn one finished mask piece inside-out and place inside of second mask piece. Pin the two mask pieces together, with 4 ½ - 5 ½ inches of elastic sandwiched in between the fabric at each of the two shortest edges. Refer to the diagram for clarification on placement of the elastic. (Measure the length of elastic that's appropriate for each person's face so it's not too tight or too loose around the ears. If size is unknown 5 inches should be ok, or you can substitute straps that tie at the back of the neck.)
4. Sew all the way around except for a 2-inch-wide hole, reinforcing the spots where the elastic meets the fabric.
5. Turn the mask right-side-out by pushing it through the hole you left in the finished mask.
6. Flatten the finished mask once it's fully turned right-side-out. Pin along the sides all the way around and sew along the edges so the mask will stay flat. When you come to the 2-inch hole just sew a bit closer to the edge to make sure you close up the hole.
7. Tada! You're done! 🌍

Takes 1.5 – 1.75 hours to make each mask for an experienced sewer.
